*** All coalition volunteer members agree that participation in the Tobacco Prevention and Control Coalition is strictly voluntary and agree not to hold the TPCC or any of its representatives or agents responsible for injuries, accidents, or stolen items. The Volunteer Member further agrees not to pursue legal action against the TPCC, BHSST, or any of its members or agents.
